WHAT TO BRING TO THE TEST SITE:

- Your admission **voucher** (or a printout of your voucher from your online account)
- A current official identification bearing your **photograph** as listed below. Copies will not be accepted. Acceptable forms of official identification: photo-bearing driver's license, passport or student ID.
* Social security cards, credit or ATM cards, and retail credit account card are not accepted as an official ID.
- **Several sharpened No. 2 pencils** with clean erasers (no pens) for all multiple-choice answer sheets.
- An analog watch (in case your exam room does not have a clock).

PROHIBITED MATERIALS:

- Electronic devices and media, such as PDAs, pagers, computers, recording devices, etc.
- A watch that beeps or has an alarm.
- Handwritten or printed materials.
- Food and drink, except water in a clear bottle with a secure lid. It must be stored under your seat, not on your desk, during the test.
- Cell phones: Please note that although you are permitted to bring cell phones to the test site, use of cell phones, including ring tones from incoming calls, is strictly prohibited and may result in the voiding of your test scores. Also note that vibrate mode is prohibited as well. All cell phones must be completely **turned off** for the duration of the exam and kept in your bag.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Examinees are responsible for their own accommodations, but a good option for affordable housing near Columbia campus can be found at International House, 500 Riverside Dr. @ 123rd St, (212) 316-8436 (call in advance for availability). \$130 for single occupancy and \$150 for double occupancy.

DIRECTIONS:

(Columbia is at Broadway & 116th Street)

By Subway:

The #1 MTA subway line stops at 116th Street Station, in front of Columbia's main gate at Broadway at 116th Street. Do NOT use MTA subway lines #2 or #3, as they follow a different route and do not stop at Columbia University. From JFK, take the free shuttle bus to Howard Beach station; take the "A" train to 59th Street (Columbus Circle), change to the #1 train and get off at 116th Street Station. The fare for a subway ride is \$2. You can purchase a Metro Card (\$4 and up) at vending machines in the stations. You get an automatic free transfer between the subway and buses, or between buses.

By NYC Bus:

Four bus lines, M4, M5, M11, and M104, serve the Columbia/Morningside Heights area from midtown Manhattan. The stop for Columbia University is 116th Street. In addition, the M60 line serves the Columbia campus from La Guardia Airport (travel time: approx. 1 hr). M4, M5, M11, M104, M60 need exact change of \$2 in coins, or you may use a Metro Card, as described above. Buses also run from regional airports to Grand Central Station and the Port Authority Bus Terminal, where a visitor can take either public transportation or a taxi uptown to campus.

By Taxi:

JFK to Manhattan: \$45 flat fare plus toll and tips. Available 24 hours a day at taxi stands outside of every terminal. Taxis going into the city can take anywhere from 30-60 minutes depending on traffic conditions.

La Guardia to Manhattan: \$22-30 plus toll and tips. Available 24 hours a day at taxi stands outside of every terminal. Taxis going into the city can take anywhere from 20-30 minutes depending on traffic conditions.

Note: Taxis usually accept cash only.

By Inter-city Bus or Train:

Most buses coming into New York City terminate at Port Authority Bus Terminal. Most inter-city trains stop at Grand Central Station or Pennsylvania Station

By Car:

(We strongly advise against coming by car, as parking is very difficult to find. There is no visitor parking on campus.)

If you must come by car, the most convenient route to Columbia is 95th /96th Street exit of Henry Hudson Parkway (West Side Highway). Use 95th Street off-ramp and turn left onto Riverside Drive. Proceed north (uptown) to 116th Street. A right turn at 116th Street leads you to the campus gate.

****Please note that for security reasons, you may be asked to show your test voucher and/or photo ID to the guards at the building entrances.***

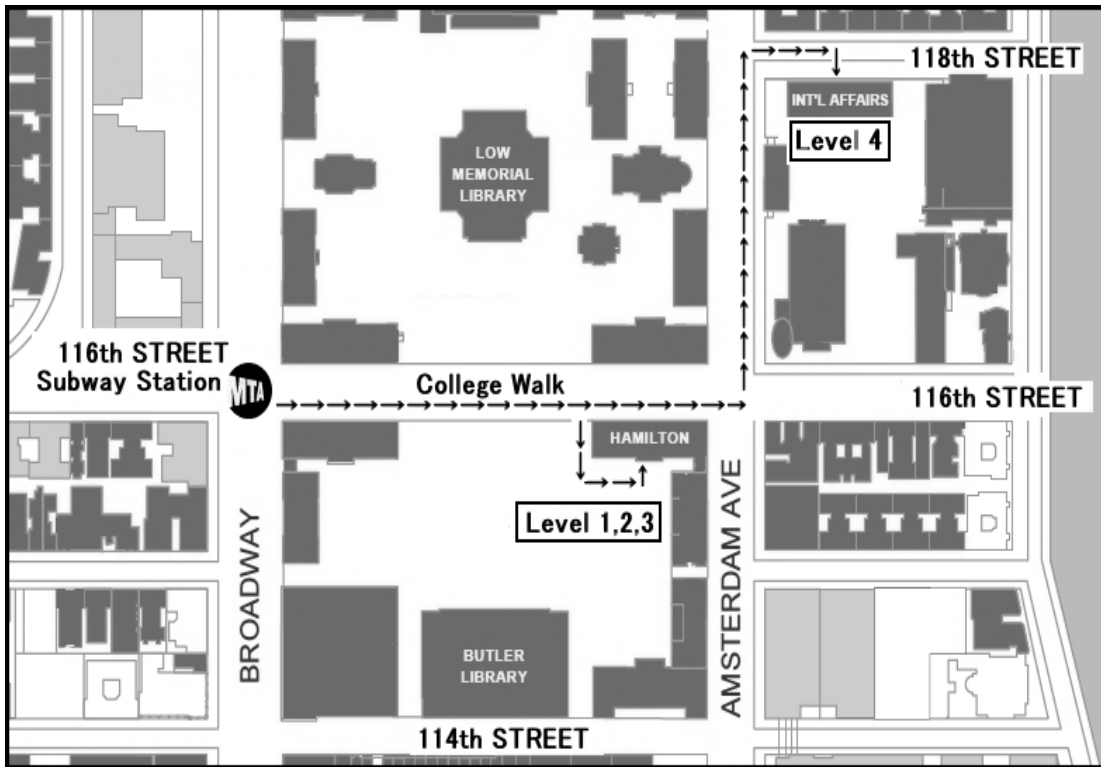
Enter through Columbia's main gate on Broadway and West 116th Street. You will be on a walkway (the "College Walk") that goes through the center of Columbia University. Walk straight ahead (heading East) to the center of the walkway. (On your left will be "Low Library," a statue of "Alma Mater" and the Low Library Steps. On your right are grass fields and a long walkway that leads to Butler Library.)

Level 1, 2, 3 Examinees

Proceed To Hamilton Hall: Continue forward on College Walk (heading eastward) a little further. **The building ahead of you and to your right is Hamilton Hall.** Immediately in front of Hamilton Hall are steps going downward. Go down the steps and then immediately turn left. Go forward a few steps and you will find the entrance to Hamilton Hall on your left. [Address: 1130 Amsterdam Avenue]

Level 4 Examinees

Proceed To IAB (Int'l Affairs Bldg): Continue forward on College Walk (heading eastward) until you reach Amsterdam Avenue. Turn left and walk up to 118th Street. Turn right and walk a little further on 118th Street. **The building to your right is IAB.** You will see the street level (4th floor) entrance to the IAB on your right. [Address: 420 West 118th Street]
